Favorite moments/Special Highlights: Tiny new peas and freshly dug potatoes from the market; artichokes; the visit to Rouen including dinner at La Couronne; visit to the Poilâne bakery’s cellar to watch the bread being mixed, kneaded and baked and to watch cookies being cut with lightning speed; the ballet at the Opéra Garnier; the raspberry tarts; the Roquefort cheese; the Dali Museum; the Renoir at the muse de la Vie Romantique; blooming chestnut trees.
