These inform you about everything happening in Paris the following week (theatre, concerts, opera, gallery, museum exhibitions, special fairs, markets, etc.) Finally, if you don't already have one, it's worth buying (also at newspaper kiosks) for about 6€ INDISPENSIBLE PLAN DE PARIS – you'll never get lost anywhere in Paris if you have this. You'll see the French referring to them all the time, too!
